  - c. Places of tourist attraction (two in each state that shares its boundary with Rajasthan). (Roll No. 20 to 28)
  - d. Show all the National parks of India. Stick pictures of any three wild animals that are found in each one of them. Also write their names. (Roll No. 29 to 35)
